2. Programme Duration:


A consensus was reached on the programme duration, setting it at 30 hours, ensuring balanced coverage of the curriculum without causing undue strain on students' schedule.

2. Programme Duration:


A consensus was reached on the programme duration, setting it at 30 hours, ensuring balanced coverage of the curriculum without causing undue strain on students' schedule.


Certification

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
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6. Numerical Skills




Certification




