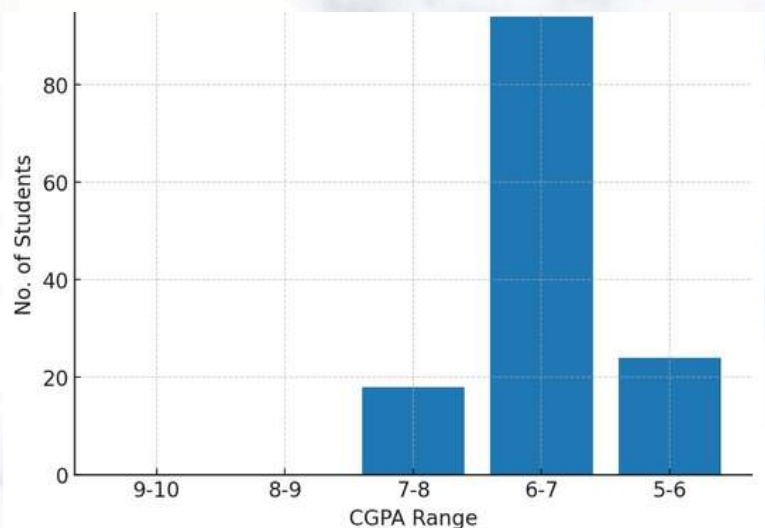
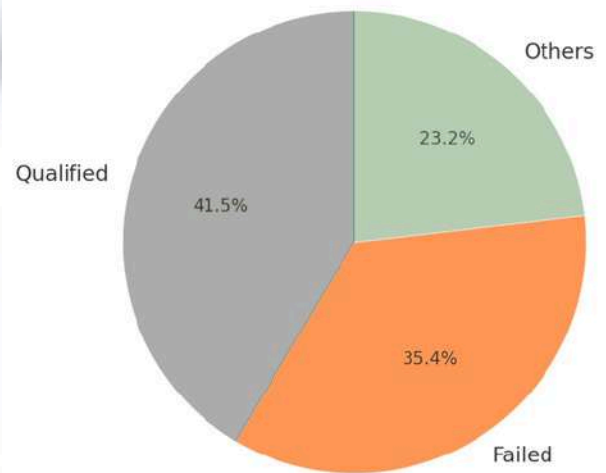

Bengali HCC – 20 (6.09%)

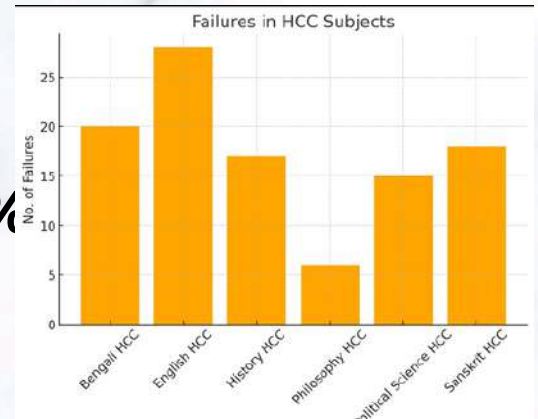
English HCC – 28 (8.53%) ✓ highest

👉 Observation: The highest failure rate is in English HCC (8.53%), followed by Sanskrit HCC (5.49%) and History HCC (5.18%).

Failures in HDS Subjects (Discipline Specific Papers)

Bengali HDS – 04 (1.22%)

English HDS – 03 (0.91%)

History HDS – 06 (1.83%)

Philosophy HDS – 15 (4.57%) ✓ highest in HDS

Political Science HDS – 05 (1.52%)

Sanskrit HDS – 02 (0.61%)



👉 Observation: The highest failure rate in HDS subjects is in Philosophy (4.57%), followed by History (1.83%).

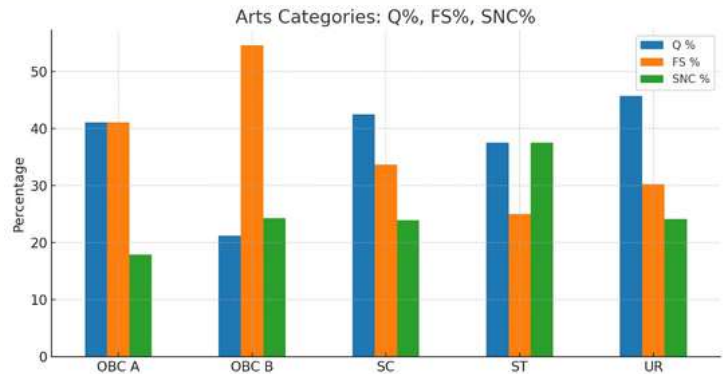

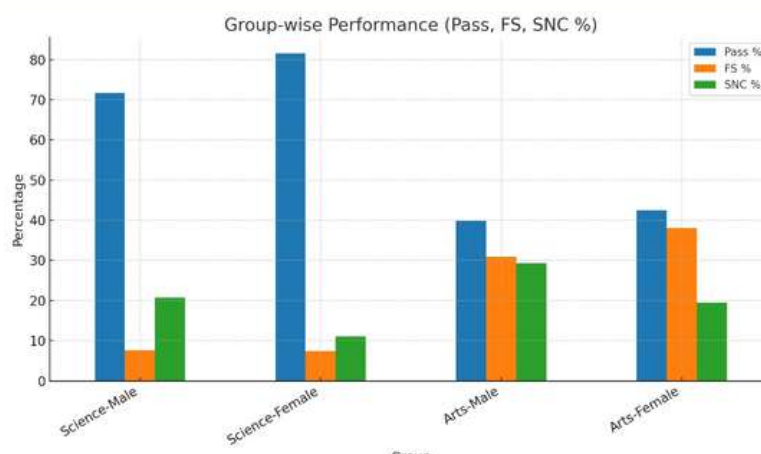
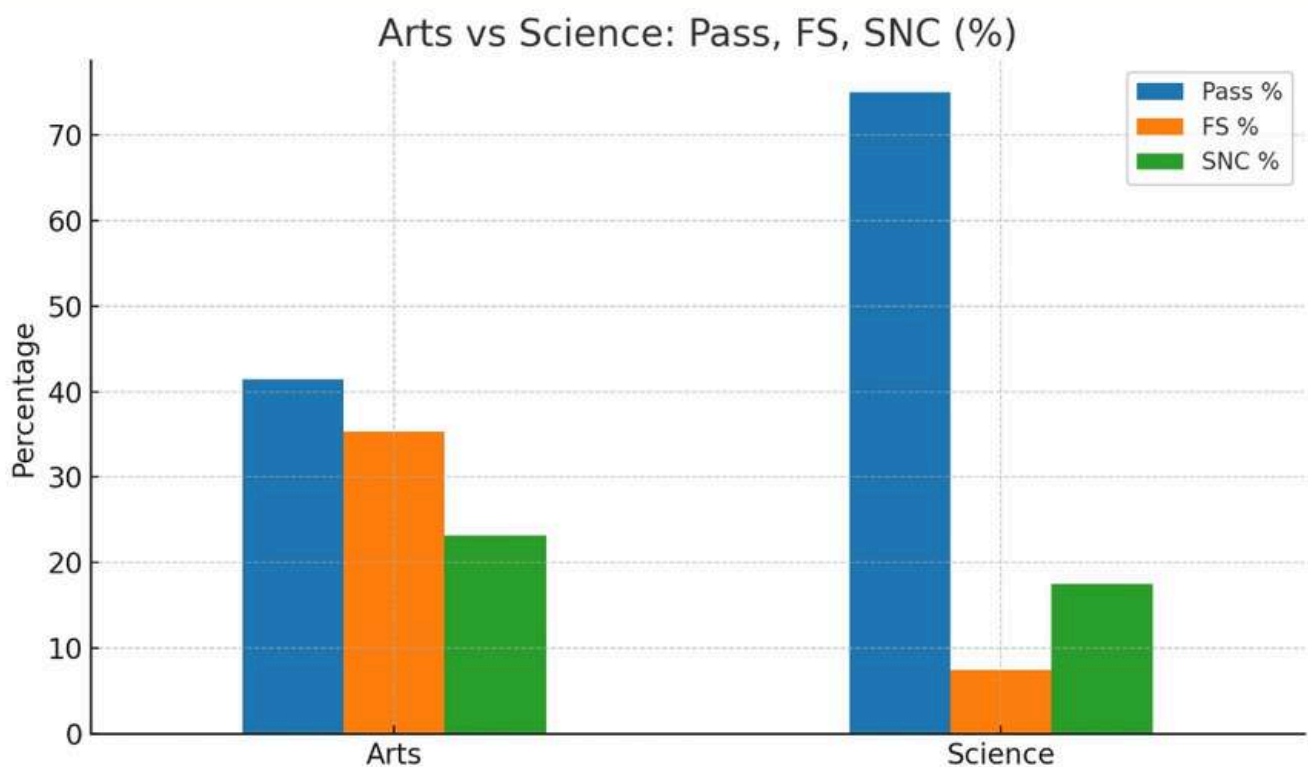

SNC(2024) - Result-

17 students from General & 17 students from Honours Qualified

Key Observations

1. Arts underperformance driven by high FS: Q 41.5%, FS 35.4%; the single largest pain-point is OBC-B (FS 54.5%, Q 21.2%).
2. OBC-A (Arts) shows balanced split between Q and FS (41.1% each)—indicating assessment difficulty or readiness gaps.
3. UR (Arts) is the relatively best Arts category (Q 45.7%), yet FS and SNC remain substantial (~30% and 24%).



Observations

- 1. Low Overall Pass Rate** – Out of 328 students, only 136 qualified, resulting in a pass percentage of 41.46%, which is below the desirable benchmark.
- 2. High Failure Percentage** – 35.36% students failed, with an additional 23.18% (SNC), reflecting major academic challenges.
- 3. CGPA Concentration in Mid-Range** – The majority of successful students (69.1%) scored within the 6–7 CGPA bracket, while only 18 students (5.49%) reached above 7 CGPA, and none achieved 8+.
- 4. Departmental Weakness in Core Papers** – The highest failure was recorded in English HCC (8.53%), followed by Sanskrit HCC (5.49%) and History HCC (5.18%).
- 5. Discipline Specific Struggles in Philosophy** – In HDS papers, Philosophy recorded the highest failure (4.57%), indicating subject-specific academic gaps.

Recommendations

- 1. Remedial & Bridge Courses** – Introduce special remedial classes in weak departments, especially English, Sanskrit, and History HCC, along with Philosophy HDS.
- 2. Skill-based Academic Strengthening** – Develop workshops and mentoring for critical reading, writing, and comprehension skills, particularly in English, to improve higher CGPA attainment.
- 3. Continuous Internal Assessment & Peer Learning** – Implement mid-semester assessments and peer group study models to track progress and reduce failure rates.
- 4. Targeted Faculty Interventions** – Encourage departments with higher failure rates to conduct question paper analysis, mock tests, and tutorial sessions for slow learners.
- 5. Motivation & Academic Counseling** – Provide counseling sessions for low-performing students (especially SNC category) to boost confidence, reduce dropouts, and improve exam preparedness.
