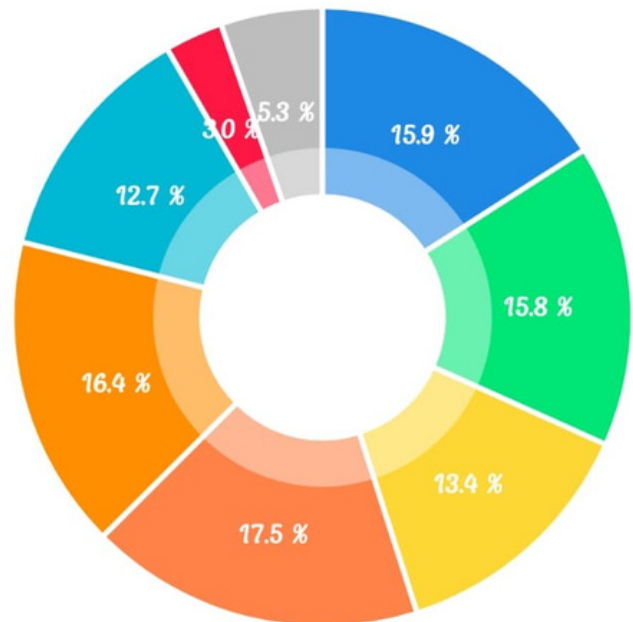

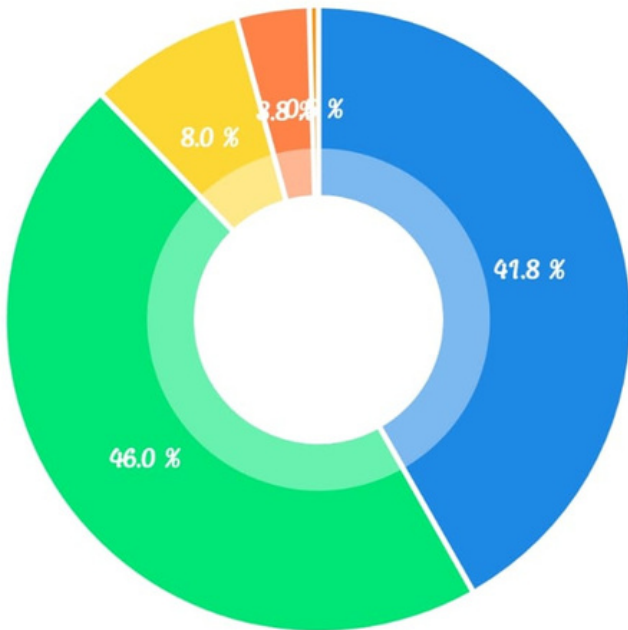

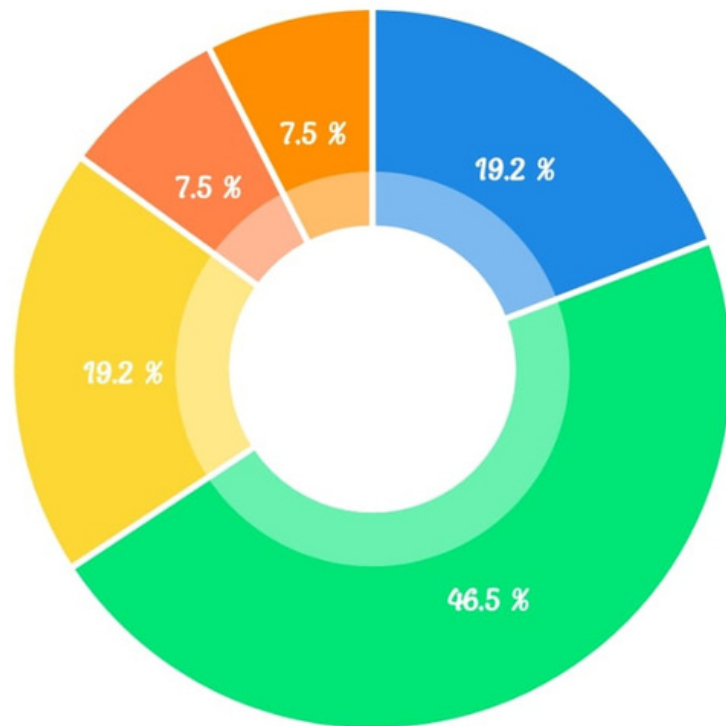

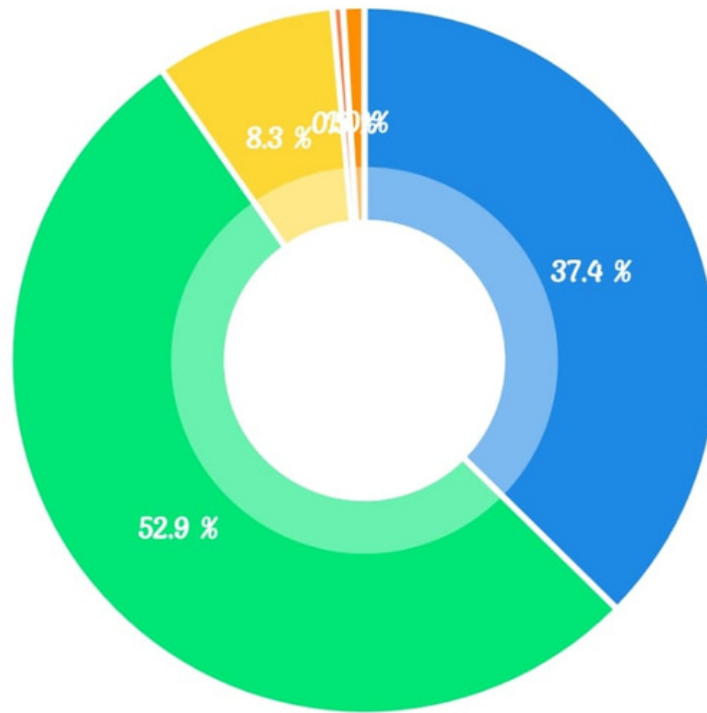
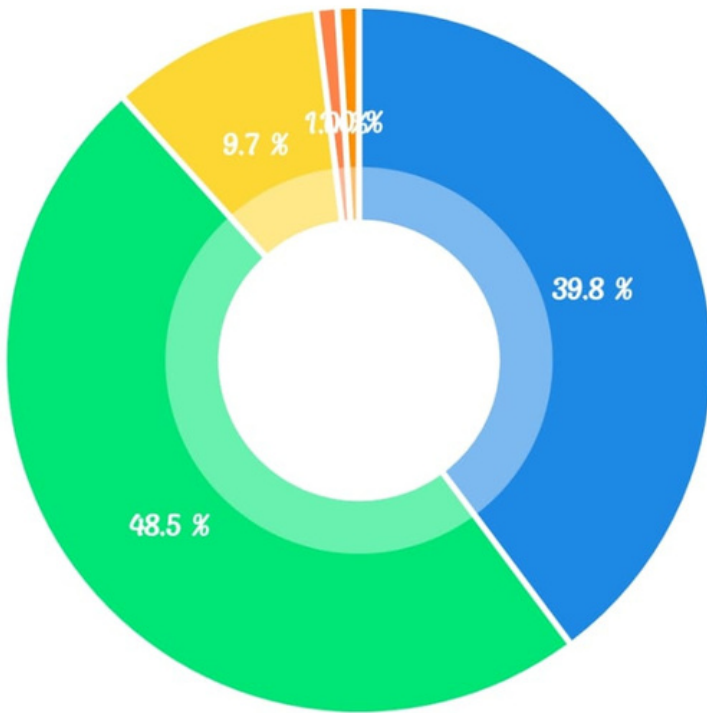
7. Security of your ward in the class Discipline

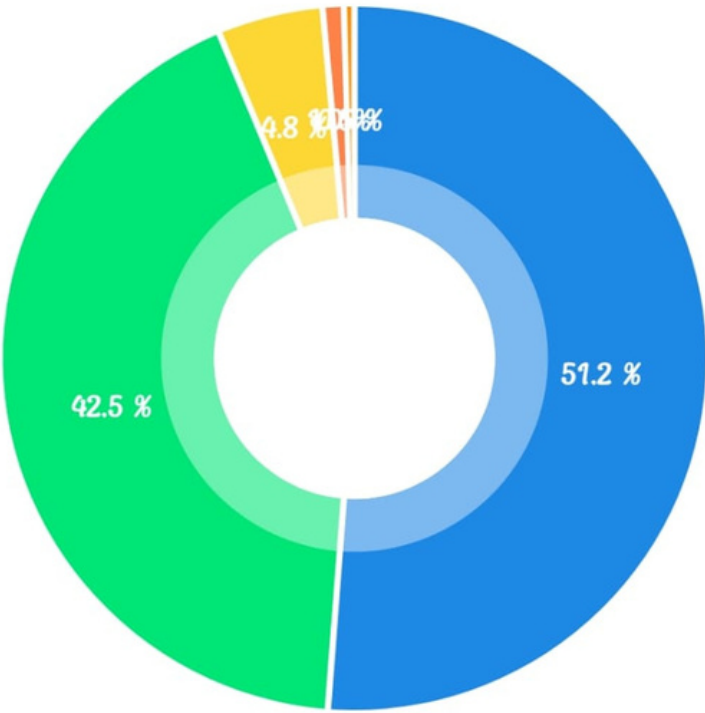
