

COLLEGE IN HISTORY

A noble dreamer, the great Sripat Singh Doogar from Jain Svetambar clan of Jiaganj, Murshidabad fulfilled his vision with all round help to establish this Institution in 1949. His vision, "Education is always prior need for any society.", was clear and still relevant for us. In 1949, it was month of April, his dream was born and continues with young minds like you.


Doogarji's wife, Raniji (Dhanya Kumari Doogar), was a kind hearted lover of education and she influenced Doogarji's dream a lot. So, in 1949, in the month of April, the deed of gift was signed. Sripat Singh Doogar gifted his palatial outhouse (the magnificent 'Cutcherry Bari'), with a further donation of seventy-five thousand rupees, for a college in this town of Jiaganj. On May 1, 1949, the Governing Body was formed with Sripat Singh Doogar as Founder President. On 11 June, the College was affiliated to the University of Calcutta, and on the auspicious morning of August 1, 1949, it took its first step as a co-educational Intermediate college with Sri Jogesh Chandra Bhattacharya as first Principal, three full-time Lecturers, one clerk, one Librarian, one helper and 42 students in the I.A. class and 29 in the I.Sc. To encourage sincere students Sripat Singhji donated Rs. 10,000.00 for funding scholarships and when this college was raised to Degree standard in 1951, in terms of Govt. rules, he made a further donation of Rs. 30,000.00 for working fund. In 1951, B.A. Pass course was started here with 9 students.

For the permanent economic security and up keeping of the college, in 1953, Sripat Singhji donated One lakh rupee (Rs. 100000.00) along with the gift of the regular annuity of Rs 6000.00 every year from his Malda Properties, in terms of government rules of the time. Thereafter, in July, 1954, W.B. Government initiated the Govt. Sponsored Scheme with Sripat Singh College as the first Govt. Sponsored Coeducational Degree College in the state.

In 1960, B.Sc. (Pass) course was introduced here. Sripat Singh Doogar donated land adjacent to the building and with his co-operation much more land was purchased in 1958 to accommodate the increased intake. In 1959, a large sum of financial assistance for construction was granted by the UGC and the WB Government. This joint fund of Rs. 1,94,000.00 was utilized for the construction of the present academic annexe, a spacious 3-storeyed building with more than thirty rooms and halls. In 1961, the building was ceremonially opened by Dr. K. L. Srimali, the Union Minister for Education.

Academic activities were transferred here in August, 1961, and the ancestral out-house of Sripat Singhji, i.e. the old building of the college has since then been named as the 'Administrative Building'.

With modern accommodational changes, you will be enjoying happy moments here and enjoy your days with the silent whispering of history you are about to be a part of.

Your college library is your place of peace, located in the administrative building of the college with total space of for reading and lending purposes. It also has a small story to speak. Ok, we think let's share with you.

The foundation of the library was laid by the Principal Aswini Kumar Choudhury and the assistant Librarian Sri Bhabani Prasad Sen. Sri Rana Mitra Sen was the first full-time Librarian of the College (04.05.1960).

In 1961 the library was shifted to the old building; Sri Sabita Prasad Dubey was the Librarian for a long time in the development period of the college. Sri Sohanlal Doogar of Calcutta donated Rs 2000 in 1963 for purchasing books. The open access system and cataloging system was initiated from 1974-1975 onward.

Our library began with only 148 textbooks. The number of books increased to 1,000 before the college got the status of Government Sponsored. The growth of the library Collection can be said to have begun from the year 1971, with 9,866 books.

In the year 1981, we had 15,384 books, in 1991 the number increased to 22,578 and at present there are 34051 books in the library. The library has been nurtured by donations from teachers, students, exstudents and others for its development.

Such actions may lead to depression, anxiety, or in extreme cases, self-harm or suicide."

Disciplinary Measures

- The institution is committed to enforcing stringent consequences against individuals found guilty of ragging:
- Suspension from classes and university examinations
- Withdrawal of institutional benefits
- Suspension or expulsion from the scholarship benefits
- Rustication for long durations
- Monetary penalties
- Legal action involving imprisonment or fines, or both.
- Collective punishment in cases where offenders remain unidentified, as a less appealing to promote accountability and peer responsibility

Zero Tolerance Policy:

The College maintains a strict zero tolerance on ragging. No act- whether minor or severe- will be overlooked, and every offender will face appropriate disciplinary action.
