Comprehensive Report on Parent–Teacher Meet: Strengthening Academic Engagement and Institutional Quality

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Sripat Singh College convened a Parent–Teacher Meet on 08 May 2026 at Rabindra Sabhagriha (Room No. 5). Commencing at 12:00 noon, the program sought to foster constructive dialogue between faculty members and parents of undergraduate and postgraduate students. The session was anchored by Dr. Sagar Simlandy, Coordinator, IQAC, who underscored the importance of collaborative engagement in addressing academic challenges and strengthening institutional quality. The august presence of Dr. Kamal Krishna Sarkar, Principal, Dr. Prasenjit Nanda, Coordinator, NAAC, and Mr. Dibakar Das, TCS lent academic gravitas to the proceedings.

In his welcome address, Dr. Kamal Krishna Sarkar, Principal, extended cordial greetings to all parents and expressed gratitude for their participation. He highlighted pressing concerns such as irregular student attendance and lack of active participation in academic activities. Stressing the importance of parental involvement, he urged guardians to encourage their wards to maintain discipline and regularity. His remarks set the intellectual tone for the deliberations, underlining the shared responsibility of faculty and parents in shaping student progress and institutional culture.

Following the Principal’s address, Dr. Prasenjit Nanda, Coordinator, NAAC, elaborated on the problem of absenteeism and its adverse impact on academic performance. Mr. Uttam Ghosh, Senior Faculty, reflected on traditional teaching challenges, time wastage, and limitations in student expression, while stressing the need for students to discover purpose in life. Mr. Dibakar Das, TCS, emphasized identifying root causes of disengagement and encouraged holistic development. Dr. Debjani Bhowmick Chakraborty, Head of Bengali Department, inspired students with the thought: “মানুষ যতটা স্বপ্ন দেখে, ততটাই মানুষ হয়, তাই স্বপ্ন দেখান।” She highlighted the absence of clear life targets among students. Similarly, Dr. Sharmila Dutta Banik, Department of History, raised concerns about irregular classes, incomplete syllabus coverage, and declining morality among students.

Several faculty members including Dr. Abhisekh Basu, Dr. Debjani Mandal, Dr. Sunita Hasda, Mr. Biplab Biswas, and Mr. Chandravan Sanyal also contributed their perspectives. They collectively emphasized the need for improved classroom discipline, timely syllabus completion, and enhanced teacher–student interaction. Their observations reinforced the importance of coordinated efforts across departments to address systemic challenges. The faculty acknowledged the role of parents as stakeholders in the educational process and welcomed their feedback for institutional improvement, thereby strengthening the intellectual fabric of the college community.

Parents actively participated in the discussion, voicing concerns about shortage of teachers in certain departments, particularly MBBT, incomplete syllabus coverage, irregular class timings, and absence of teachers during scheduled hours. They also raised issues related to scholarships, communication gaps, and requested timely notices. Some parents suggested direct communication channels between faculty and guardians, while others advocated for disciplinary measures to improve student accountability. Notable contributions came from Mr. Kalyan Asis Das (father of Bidisha Das), Mrs. Bulti Mondol (mother of Dipti Mondol), Mr. Manik Bhaskar (father of Jit Bhaskar), Mrs. Pinki Singh (mother of Richa Singh), and Mrs. Rupa Pramanik (mother of Snigdha Pramanik). Their observations provided valuable insights into parental expectations and highlighted areas requiring administrative attention.

The Parent–Teacher Meet successfully created a platform for constructive dialogue between faculty and guardians. Key issues such as absenteeism, syllabus completion, and communication gaps were identified, alongside suggestions for disciplinary measures and improved teacher accountability. The IQAC resolved to document the proceedings and initiate structured follow-up measures to address the concerns raised. The event reaffirmed the importance of collaborative engagement in enhancing student discipline, academic participation, and overall institutional performance. The session concluded with a Vote of Thanks delivered by Dr. Sagar Simlandy, Coordinator, IQAC, who expressed heartfelt gratitude to the Principal, faculty members, parents, and students for their active participation. He acknowledged the valuable insights shared during the meet and assured that the college administration would take necessary steps to address the concerns raised. His closing remarks emphasized the collective responsibility of faculty, parents, and students in nurturing academic excellence and holistic development at Sripat Singh College.
