# Executive Summary

## **Value-Added Course on Heritage in India**

**Organized by: Department of History, Heritage Club & IQAC of Sripat Singh College, Jiaganj, Murshidabad**

**In collaboration with: Ramakrishna Mission Swami Vivekananda's Ancestral House and Cultural Centre, Kolkata**

**Duration: 28th January – 13th May, 2025**

**The Value-Added Course on Heritage in India (2025) was a 3.5-month-long (40 hours duration) initiative designed to bridge the gap between academic knowledge and India's rich cultural, moral, and philosophical heritage. It comprised 26 sessions, including an online assessment and an offline valedictory function.**

**The course was structured thematically, starting with value education and music, and progressing through discipline, citizenship, financial literacy, emotional intelligence, and concluding with themes like peace, constitutional values, and humaneness. Classes were conducted primarily in the evening to ensure inclusivity for both students and working professionals.**

**A total of 104 students successfully completed this course, and eminent speakers—including Swami Jnanalokananda, Dr. Sonali Chakrabarty, and Dr. Arnab Ghosh—shared insights on Indian heritage, ethics, and self-development. The course followed a dual assessment model: 50% class attendance and 50% MCQ-based online test, ensuring fair evaluation and consistent engagement.**

## Background of the Course

India is a land of immense cultural diversity and civilizational depth, with a heritage shaped by centuries of dynasties, religions, languages, philosophies, and artistic expressions. This rich tapestry not only reflects the soul of the nation but also provides essential insights into the socio-cultural evolution of the subcontinent. However, with the growing influence of modernization and globalization, a widening gap has emerged between the younger generation and their cultural roots. To bridge this divide and reintroduce traditional knowledge systems in education, Sripat Singh College, Jiaganj, initiated a Value-Added Course (VAC) on Heritage in India, conducted from 28th January to 13th May 2025.

Structured across 26 sessions in online and offline modes, the course brought together a diverse panel of academicians, educationists, and spiritual leaders. It aimed to foster awareness and appreciation for India's tangible and intangible heritage, encourage cultural sensitivity, and promote ethical values. Thematically arranged, the sessions began with foundational concepts like Value Education and Music, and progressed toward practical life skills—such as Discipline, Citizenship, Time Management, and Financial Literacy—before culminating in philosophical themes like Peace, Dreams and Practicality, and Humaneness. Each session (7:00 pm–8:30 pm) ensured consistent engagement.

Blending theoretical knowledge with interactive experiences, the course sought to nurture informed, responsible, and culturally rooted citizens. The final assessment and valedictory ceremony celebrated this journey of learning. The initiative reflects the institution's commitment to holistic education and heritage conservation in contemporary academic contexts.

## Objectives of the Course

The Value-Added Course on Heritage in India was designed with the aim of enriching students' understanding of India's diverse and layered heritage. In an age where traditional values and indigenous knowledge systems face marginalization, the course sought to reconnect learners with the roots of Indian civilization, promoting a sense of identity, pride, and responsibility.

# Course Design & Structure

The Value-Added Course (VAC) on Heritage in India, conducted from 28th January to 13th May 2025 at Sripat Singh College, reflects a well-structured and holistic academic initiative. Designed across 26 sessions (including offline and online modes), the course spans over 3 months and involves diverse resource persons from academic and spiritual backgrounds.

The course structure is thematically progressive, beginning with an inauguration and foundational concepts such as Value Education and Music and Value Education. Gradually, it transitions into character-building themes like Discipline, Citizenship, and Self-Motivation, then moves towards contemporary societal concerns like Time Management, Financial Knowledge, Social Values, and Emotional Intelligence. The final sessions reflect on broader philosophical themes, including Humaneness, Indian Constitution, and Peace.

Each session runs for 1.5 hours, maintaining uniform timing (7:00 pm–8:30 pm), ensuring consistency and facilitating learner engagement. The final assessment and valedictory function are conducted offline, promoting formal evaluation and recognition of learning.

Notably, the course includes practical, spiritual, and psychological perspectives, integrating Swamijis and academicians alike. The presence of topics such as Prayers and Motivation, Man vs. Animal Ethics, and Dreams and Practicality speaks to the course's interdisciplinary nature.

In conclusion, the course design is coherent, value-oriented, and well-paced. It promotes intellectual, ethical, and emotional development among learners, aligning with the objectives of holistic education and nation-building.



# Course Summary: Value-Added Course on Heritage in India (28-01-2025 to 13-05-2025)

The Value-Added Course (VAC) on Heritage in India, organized by Sripat Singh College, Jiaganj, Murshidabad, was conducted from 28th January 2025 to 13th May 2025, spanning 26 sessions including an examination and a valedictory function. The course began with an inaugural offline session led by Swami Jnanalokanandaji on 28-01-2025, setting the tone for the programme. The sessions were scheduled mostly in the evenings (7:00 pm to 8:30 pm), accommodating students and working professionals. Eminent scholars and experts from various disciplines addressed a wide range of topics relating to Indian heritage, values, education, culture, and self-development. Prominent resource persons included Sri Sudipta Chakrabarty who explored “Value Education – why, definition,” and Dr. Aparajita Roychowdhury who delved into “Music and Value Education.” Topics such as “Character & Character Building” by Dr. Prasenjit Saha, “Ideals” by Arijit Roy, and “Love, Regards and Respect” by Dr. Piku Chowdhury enriched the philosophical and ethical dimensions of the course.

Sessions like “Education as envisaged by Swami Vivekananda” by Dr. Sonali Chakrabarty, and “Prayers and Self-Motivation” by Swami Atmanathananda reinforced spiritual and value-based perspectives. Topics on national and constitutional heritage were effectively covered by Dr. Arnab Ghosh, who spoke on “Swamiji, Netaji and Indian Constitution.”

Additionally, the course integrated practical and societal aspects through sessions like “Discipline and Time Management” by Srimoyee Kusum Bhattacharya, “Social and Familial Values” by Sri Arindam Das, and “Basics of Financial Principles and Knowledge” by Dr. Subir Dutta. The academic culmination of the course was marked by an examination held on 02-05-2025 (offline), followed by a valedictory function on 13-05-2025, again graced by Swami Jnanalokanandaji and the Principal. The course offered a holistic learning experience, blending Indian cultural ethos, educational thought, and life skills over more than three months, making it an enriching opportunity for character formation and heritage appreciation.

# Assessment Criteria & Methodology

The Value-Added Course on Heritage in India at Sripat Singh College (28th January – 13th May 2025) followed a structured assessment methodology based on two equal components: class attendance and a final online test, each carrying 50% weightage. Students were required to attend a minimum of 75% of the 25 sessions to be eligible for certification. Attendance was evaluated proportionately—those with full attendance earned full 50% marks, while lower attendance resulted in proportionally reduced scores. This criterion emphasized the importance of regular participation and ensured that students engaged with sessions conducted by distinguished resource persons like Dr. Aparajita Roychowdhury, Dr. Sonali Chakrabarty, and Sri Suman Bhattacharya.

The final assessment, conducted on 13th May 2025 from 1:00 PM to 1:40 PM via Google Form (online mode), consisted of 50 multiple-choice questions (MCQs). The questions covered key themes discussed throughout the course, including Indian values, humaneness, education, time management, and constitutional awareness. Students were given 40 minutes to complete the test. Each question carried equal marks, with no negative marking. This dual evaluation method—balancing consistent participation with knowledge assessment—ensured a fair and comprehensive reflection of student learning and engagement with India's cultural and ethical heritage.

# Student Feedback Report

A total of 104 students successfully completed the Value-Added Course on Heritage in India, which ran from 28th January to 13th May 2025. The feedback received from the students has been overwhelmingly positive, reflecting their appreciation for both the course content and the method of delivery. Most students acknowledged that the course enriched their understanding of India's cultural, ethical, and philosophical heritage, which they found both academically valuable and personally inspiring. They expressed particular interest in the sessions on character building, value education, career planning, and Indian Constitution, stating that the ideas shared during these talks were not only intellectually stimulating but also highly relevant to contemporary life and personal development.

Students were especially appreciative of the diverse panel of resource persons, including respected educators and spiritual leaders such as Swami Jnanalokanandaji, Dr. Aparajita Roychowdhury, Dr. Sonali Chakrabarty, and Sri Suman Bhattacharya. The speakers' delivery styles, practical examples, and real-life connections helped students relate the heritage topics to their own lives. Many students commented that they felt a renewed sense of responsibility toward society, citizenship, and moral values. The engaging sessions on topics like Education as envisioned by Swami Vivekananda, Love and Respect, Self-Motivation, and Social Values deeply resonated with the participants.

Regarding the assessment method, students expressed satisfaction with the online MCQ-based final test conducted via Google Form. They found the format user-friendly and appreciated the balanced questions that tested their understanding across all sessions. The 40-minute time duration for 50 questions was considered appropriate, and students remarked that it encouraged them to revise and retain key ideas discussed throughout the course. They also appreciated the fair evaluation structure, with equal weightage (50%) given to attendance and assessment, which motivated them to remain attentive and consistent.

In conclusion, students described the course as a transformative educational experience that not only enhanced their academic knowledge but also nurtured their inner values. They have expressed interest in attending similar value-based and culturally rooted courses in the future, and thanked the college administration and respected Principal Dr. Kamal Krishna Sarkar for organizing such a meaningful initiative.



# **Course Outcome: Knowledge Base**

The diverse themes, such as self-motivation and education for empowerment, helped students develop a structured approach to setting goals and managing time effectively.

Additionally, the course improved students' analytical and reflective thinking by engaging them in discussions about Indian heritage, ethics, and social values. Exposure to topics related to the Indian Constitution, family structure, and community service sharpened their civic awareness and ethical judgment, skills vital for socially conscious professionals. The final MCQ assessment helped students practice quick thinking and decision-making under time constraints, simulating real-world testing environments. Overall, the course fostered a holistic skill development approach, preparing students not just academically but also as value-driven individuals ready to contribute meaningfully to society and the workplace.

Many students reported that the course inspired them to reflect more deeply on their values, behavior, and responsibilities as citizens. Sessions on topics like love and respect in family, self-motivation, and education as a path to self-realization helped students view their personal and academic challenges through a more thoughtful and value-based lens. It encouraged them to adopt a more compassionate, ethical, and purposeful approach to everyday life.

Furthermore, the course shifted their understanding of heritage from being merely historical knowledge to a living guide for personal growth and social contribution. Students began to see India's cultural and constitutional values as tools to shape their mindset, aspirations, and conduct. The exposure to philosophical teachings and moral principles empowered them to develop stronger character, emotional resilience, and a sense of direction. Many students expressed a new-found respect for their roots and a desire to uphold and share these values in their personal and professional lives. In essence, the course expanded their worldview and nurtured a deeper sense of identity grounded in India's timeless wisdom.



# Implementation Challenges

While the Value-Added Course on Heritage in India was successfully conducted, a few implementation challenges were encountered during its planning and execution:

- 1. Student Attendance Consistency:** Maintaining regular attendance over 25 sessions was a challenge, as students had varying academic and personal schedules, leading to occasional drop in participation.
- 2. Time Management with Academic Calendar:** Aligning the course with the existing academic schedule, examinations, and departmental activities required careful coordination to avoid overlap and student fatigue.
- 3. Online Assessment Preparedness:** Conducting the final assessment online via Google Form posed challenges related to internet connectivity, device availability, and ensuring a fair examination environment.
- 4. Engaging Diverse Student Backgrounds:** Students came from different academic streams and socio-cultural contexts. Ensuring equal engagement and understanding across all groups required continuous adaptation of communication and examples.
- 5.. Resource Person Coordination:** Scheduling sessions with eminent speakers was difficult due to their limited availability and geographical constraints, sometimes requiring rescheduling and adjustments.
- 6. Technological Limitations:** For virtual presentations or sessions involving multimedia, occasional technical glitches (audio-visual issues, power failure) disrupted the learning flow and required backup plans.

# Suggestions for Future Batches

- 1. Hybrid Mode of Delivery (Maximum Classes):** Combine online and offline sessions to ensure flexibility and better participation, especially for students with scheduling conflicts.
- 2. Shorter, Thematic Modules:** Break the course into smaller thematic units (e.g., Heritage & Ethics, Heritage & Education) for focused learning and better retention.
- 3. Interactive Activities:** Include group discussions, debates, or project-based learning to enhance student engagement and application of concepts.
- 4. Guest Lectures with Q&A:** Allocate specific time for live interaction with resource persons to make sessions more dynamic and participatory.
- 5. Assessment Variety:** Add short reflective writing, quizzes, or creative assignments alongside MCQs to assess deeper understanding and expression.
- 6. Feedback Mechanism:** Collect periodic student feedback during the course to adapt session content, pace, and teaching style as needed.

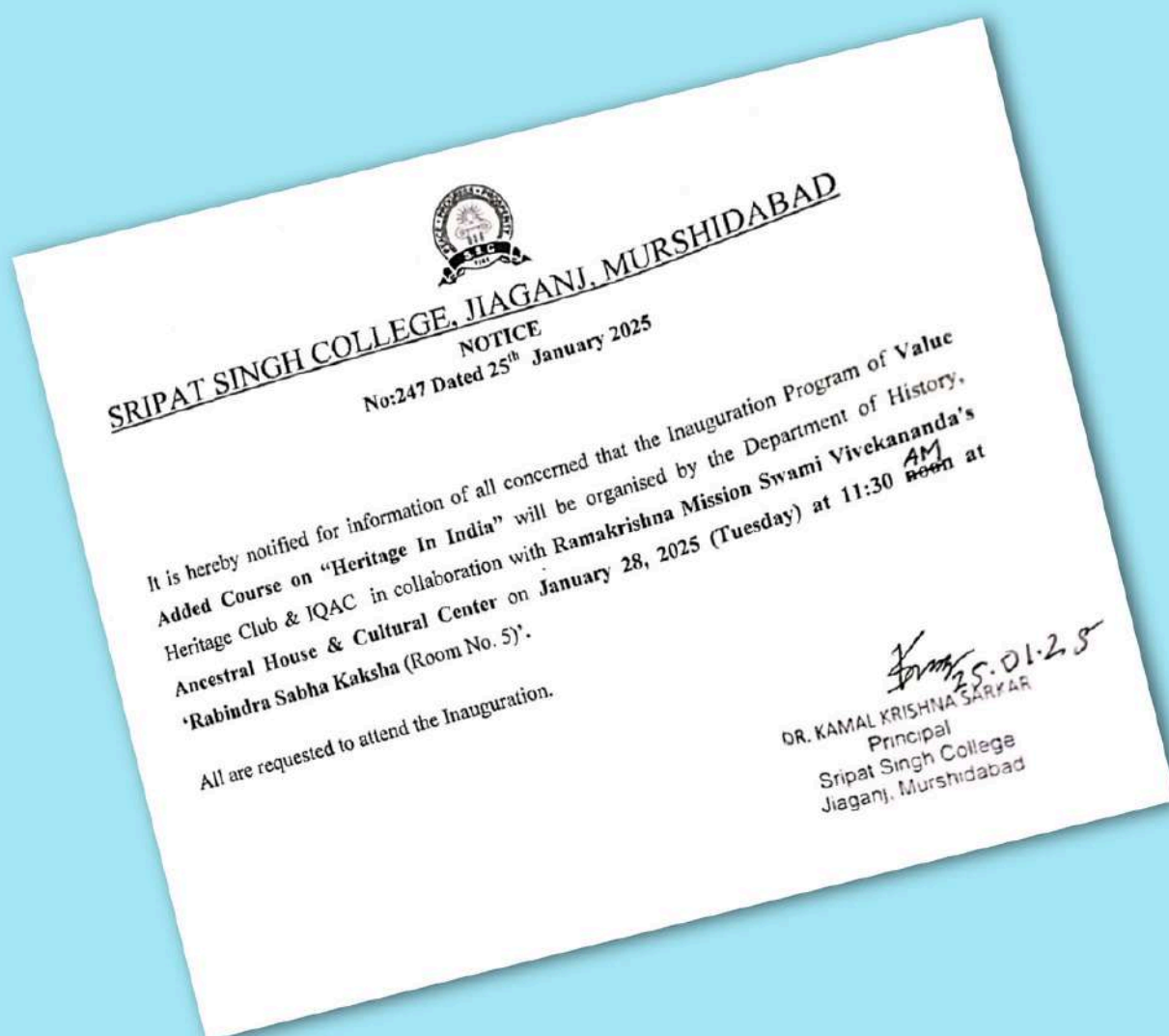

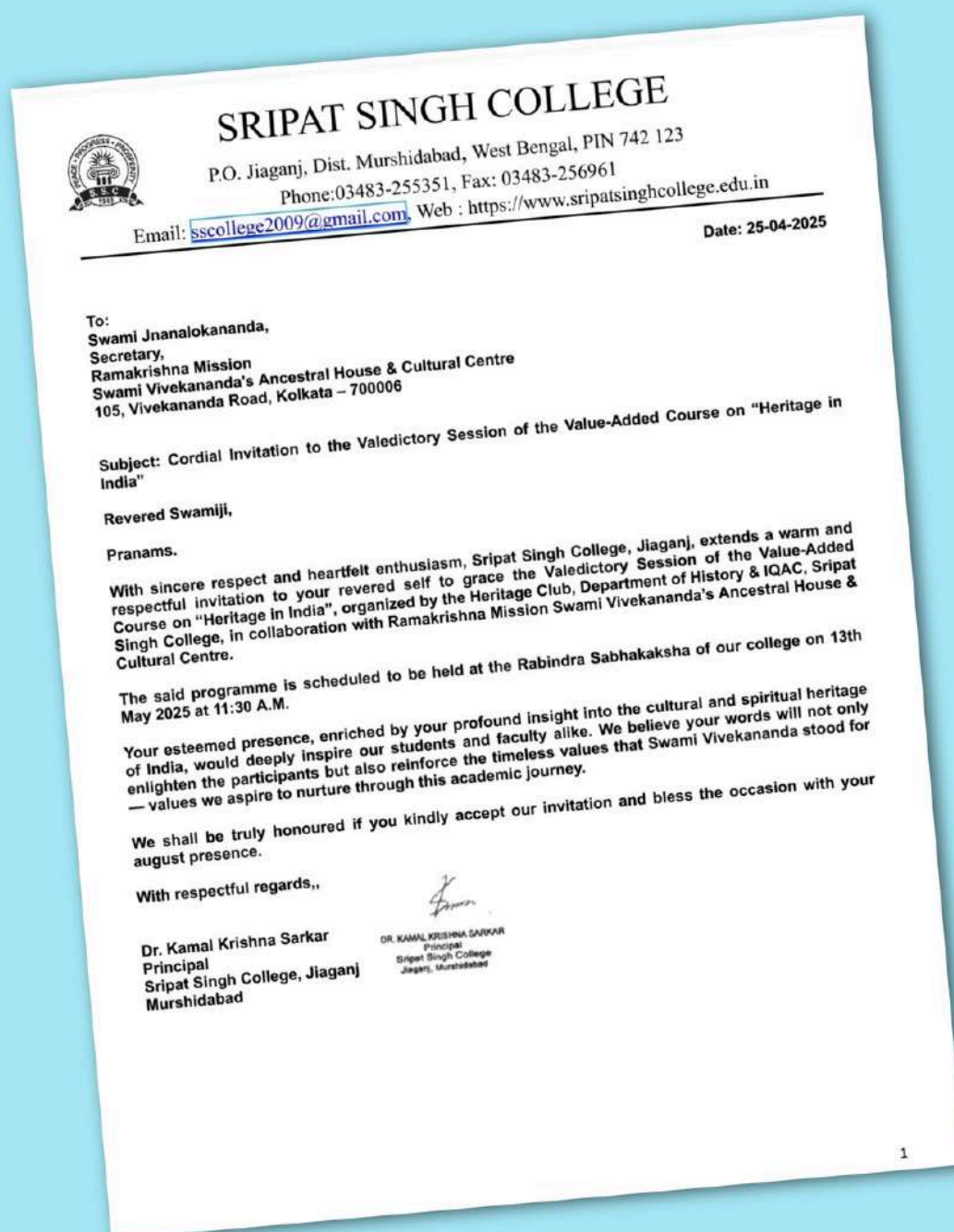

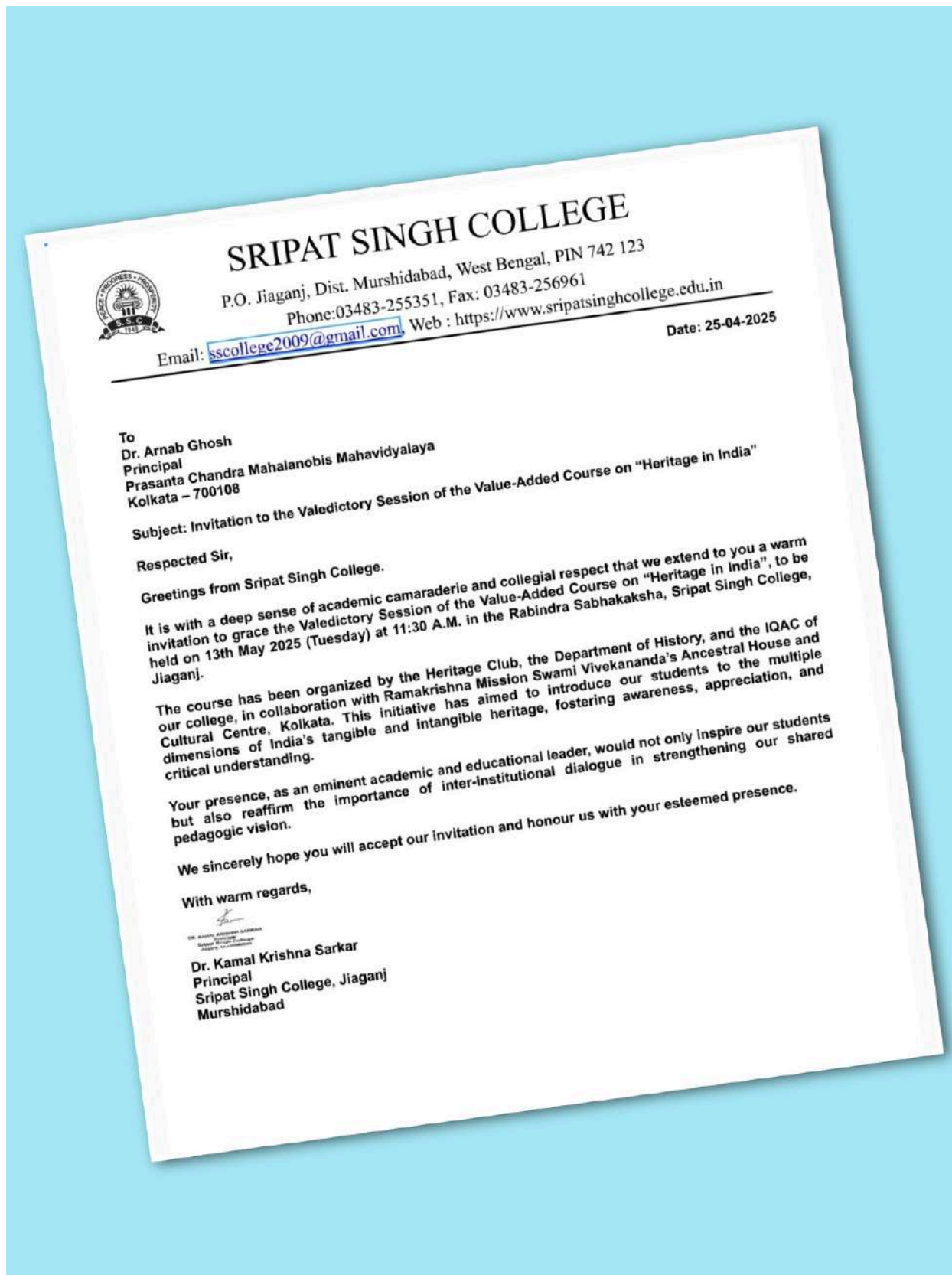
