Sripat Singh College Internal Quality Assurance Cell Add-on Course on Human Rights & Indian Constitution

Sripat Singh College successfully concluded its certificate course on "Human Rights & Indian Constitution," which commenced on 19 February 2024 and ended on 23 March 2024. The course, spanning 35 hours over 2 months, aimed to deepen students' understanding of human rights principles within the context of the Indian Constitution.

With an intake capacity of 346 students, the course saw enthusiastic participation from students pursuing B.A. & B.Sc at Sripat Singh College. The interactive sessions, which combined online and offline components, allowed students to engage with the course material effectively.

The course covered a wide range of topics, including an introduction to human rights, an overview of the Indian Constitution, fundamental rights and duties, directive principles of state policy, and the role of the judiciary in upholding human rights. The knowledge gained from the course is expected to have a lasting impact on students' understanding of their rights and responsibilities as citizens. To successfully complete the course, students were required to maintain a minimum attendance of 75% and pass the assessments. Upon successful completion, students were awarded a certificate, recognizing their efforts and commitment to learning.

Feedback from students indicated a high level of satisfaction with the course content and delivery. However, some students suggested that future iterations of the course could include more practical exercises and case studies to enhance learning outcomes.

The Add-on Course on Human Rights & Indian Constitution at Sripat Singh College has been a valuable addition to the academic calendar, providing students with a deeper understanding of human rights principles. It is hoped that the knowledge gained from this course will empower students to become informed and responsible citizens, advocating for human rights in their communities.


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


